Graduation Requirements	Graduation Pathway Options
1) High School Diploma	Meet the statutorily defined diploma credit and curricular requirements
2) Learn and Demonstrate Employability Skills	Learn employability skills standards through locally developed programs. Employability skills are demonstrated by one the following: • Project-Based Learning Experience; OR • Service-Based Learning Experience; OR • Work-Based Learning Experience.2
3) Postsecondary-Ready Competencies3 (Students must complete at least one of the following.) Apprenticeship



Service-based learning integrates meaningful service to enrich and apply academic knowledge, teach civic and personal responsibility (and other employability skills), and strengthen communities.



Looks like:

Participation in a meaningful volunteer or civic engagement experience OR

Engagement in a school-based activity, such as a cocurricular or <u>extracurricular activity</u> or sport <u>for at least</u> <u>one academic year.</u>

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

Documentation

- Documentation is flexible and will vary locally.
- Indiana FIRST has provided a reflection template for use by teams to document participation and employability skills gained through an FRC team experience. (See IndianaFIRST website)
- Students should build a portfolio through their time on an FRC team (digital and/or paper) and include this in their portfolio. It is their responsibility to document, but school-based coaches should lead in having students fill out these forms.
